CITY OF FULTON COUNCIL MINUTES REGULAR SESSION TUESDAY, MARCH 12, 2024

The Council of the City of Fulton, Missouri, met in Regular Session on Tuesday, March 12, 2024, in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 18 E. 4th Street.

Present and presiding were: Mayor Steve F. Myers; Kathie Ratliff, City Clerk; and William Ladwig, Police Chief. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Myers at 7:00p.m. Roll call was noted by the City Clerk, and members of the Council present were: Bill Hinchie; Brad Leuther; Lauren Nelson; Mary Rehklau; Jeff Stone; and Bob Washington. Courtney L. Doyle, Director of Administration, and Councilmembers Alan Combs and Valerie Sebacher was absent.

COUNCIL CONCERNS:

Councilman Hinchie expressed gratitude to the city engineer and chief of police for their unwavering support in facilitating the approval of the four-way intersection on Wood Street.

Councilwoman Rehklau voiced concerns regarding homes lacking addresses and urged residents to affix addresses to their homes to aid emergency access.

Councilman Stone mentioned the Historic Preservation Commission meeting scheduled for March 20.

Councilman Leuther provided an overview of the recent Airport Advisory Board meeting, noting positive feedback and effective collaboration between the board and the City. Raised safety concerns regarding the Wood Street intersection and requested a review of the City of Fulton calendar.

Councilwoman Nelson shared her additional thanks for the Route Z/Wood Street intersection and expressed concern, suggesting a similar display for Tennyson & Mokane Road despite it not being a city sign.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Nelson and Seconded by Councilwoman Rehklau to adopt Resolution 3527 at tonight's council meeting. Motion carried with six members of the Council voting in favor, two members absent (Combs and Sebacher).

Resolution 3528: Real Estate Purchase Agreement

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Fulton, Missouri, to execute a real estate contract to purchase a piece of property located in Fulton, Missouri and establishing an effective date.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Nelson and Seconded by Councilman Stone to adopt Resolution 3528 at tonight's council meeting. Motion carried with six members of the Council voting in favor, two members absent (Combs and Sebacher).

Resolution 3529: Consulting Services Contract

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Fulton, Missouri, to sign all necessary documents in relation to a contract with Platte Landing Utility Services, LLC (PLUS) of Parkville, Missouri, for consulting and engineering services to assist with the I-70 pipeline crossing, and establishing an effective date.

Motion was made by Councilman Hinchie and Seconded by Councilman Stone to adopt Resolution 3529 at tonight's council meeting. Motion carried with six members of the Council voting in favor, two members absent (Combs and Sebacher).

Bill No. 1705: Rezoning 303 Claymine Drive

Motion was made by Councilman Leuther and Seconded by Councilwoman Nelson to place Bill No. 1705 for Second Reading at the next regularly-scheduled council meeting. Motion carried with six members of the Council voting in favor, two members absent (Combs and Sebacher).

Bill No. 1706: Rezoning 707 W. Chestnut Street

An Ordinance reclassifying, under the zoning code, a tract of land located at 707 W. Chestnut Street in Fulton, Missouri, and establishing and effective date.

Motion was made by Councilman Washington and Seconded by Councilman Hinchie to place Bill No. 1706 for Second Reading at the next regularly-scheduled council meeting. Motion carried with six members of the Council voting in favor, two members absent (Combs and Sebacher).
