CITY OF FULTON COUNCIL MINUTES REGULAR SESSION TUESDAY, AUGUST 13, 2024

The Council of the City of Fulton, Missouri, met in Regular Session on Tuesday, August 13, 2024, in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 18 E. 4th Street.

Present and presiding were: Mayor Steve F. Myers; Sam Shults, Assistant Director of Administration; Kathie Ratliff, City Clerk; and William Ladwig, Police Chief. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Myers at 6:30 p.m. Roll call was noted by the City Clerk, and members of the Council present were: Alan Combs, Bill Hinchie, Brad Leuther, Lauren Nelson, Mary Rehklau, Jeff Stone, Bob Washington, and Mike West.

Also present were: Kyle Bruemmer, City Engineer; Dustin Dougherty, Chief Financial Officer; Darrell Dunlap, Superintendent of Utilities; Tara O'Shea, interim Parks & Recreation Director; Russ Sing, Fire Chief; and Jordan Lewis, Audio/Video. Guests present were Fulton Sun Editor Emily O'Leary, Kathy Nielsen, & Dustin Hathaway.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Rev. Williamson.

COMMENTS FROM VISITORS.

Dustin Hathaway, 227 E. 6th Street stated that he filed a complaint with the city about drivers turning right on red lights. He expressed frustration that his previous complaints have not been addressed by the city or police. He demanded action, stating that the current situation is unacceptable and warned that legal action may follow if nothing is done.

PPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA:

Motion was the made by Councilman West and Seconded by Councilman Leuther to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion carried with eight members of the Council voting in favor.

COUNCIL CONCERNS:

Councilman Hinchie: He expressed gratitude to the city engineer and his team for replacing the sign near the kindergarten. He noted that there was no Public Safety Commission meeting.

Councilman West: Reported that the Human Rights Commission met but did not have a quorum. They plan to present the JBF award at an upcoming council meeting. He raised concerns about a recent accident at Route C and Tennyson, suggesting the Public Safety Commission consider installing a stop sign or reducing speed in the area. He acknowledged that it falls under Missouri state jurisdiction but hopes it can be addressed. Chief Ladwig provided a brief overview of the accident and mentioned that the speed limit is set by the state, but offered to contact MoDOT for further discussion.

Councilwoman Rehklau: Voiced her support for Councilman West's concerns and offered to assist in discussions with MoDOT.

buncilman Stone: Mentioned that the Historic Preservation Commission met, but they lacked a quorum. He shared updates on the Commission's work, particularly related to the city's CLG certification. He also raised concerns about the Public Utility Board's (PUB) discussion on solid waste bins, noting that they (the PUB) are considering recommending a warning/fine to the Council.

Councilman Leuther: Provided a brief update on ongoing airport repairs, including work on the landings and beacon. He expressed concerns about erosion at the roundabout, particularly regarding the concrete structure. City Engineer Bruemmer will contact MoDOT to investigate the issue.

Councilman Combs: Reported that the Planning & Zoning Commission has not yet met but has a meeting scheduled later this month. He raised concerns about the trail near the YMCA and the high school, suggesting it be reopened to benefit students who walk to school.

Councilman Washington: Announced an upcoming Park Board meeting and highlighted community events at Carver Park, including Back to School activities organized by local churches on August 17th. He also inquired about the status of home demolitions, with City Engineer Bruemmer indicating they will begin soon.

Councilwoman Nelson: Reported that the Public Utility Board has not met but will do so at the end of the month. She thanked the street department and others involved in resurfacing Westminster and updating the lines. She also expressed appreciation for the Facebook updates and public notices in regards to street work.

Mayor: Noted the need for more members on city boards.

An Ordinance fixing the tax rate and levying taxes for the calendar year of 2024, on all taxable property in the City of Fulton, Missouri, at \$0.5271 for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the assessed valuation of said property and establishing an effective date.

Motion was made by Councilman West and Seconded by Councilwoman Nelson to move Bill No. 1721 to Second Reading at the next regularly-scheduled council meeting. Motion carried with eight members of the Council voting in favor.

Bill No. 1722: Willow Creek South Plat One - Final

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Fulton, Missouri, to approve the Final Plat for Willow Creek South Plat One.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Rehklau and Seconded by Councilman Stone to move Bill No. 1722 to Second Reading at the next regularly-scheduled council meeting. Motion carried with seven members of the Council voting in favor, one opposed (West).
